PARKER LIAUTAUD: A YOUNG MAN WITH A MISSION:

Parker Liautaud is only 18 years old, but he has already been on expeditions to both the North Pole and the South Pole. His adventures have attracted the attention of young people everywhere, which is exactly what he wants. Because of his fame, they listen when he speaks of a serious danger to the planet: global warming.

For several decades, temperatures around the world have been rising steadily. According to scientists, much of this change in the climate is caused by the gases that are produced by vehicles and power stations. The warmer temperatures are already responsible for the rapid melting of ice at the Earth's poles and for changes in the amount of rainfall around the world. Scientists warn that in the future, cities near the sea may be flooded, and farm lands may turn into deserts. Parker believes it is the duty of his generation to help slow down global warming since they have the most to lose.

From a very young age, Parker was fascinated by the polar regions of the Earth. Therefore, he was very excited when he got the chance to join an expedition to the South Pole in 2009. That was when he first learned about the harmful effects of climate change. He became so worried that a year later he founded The Last Degree, an organization which tries to convince young people to join the struggle against global warming. In addition, he spreads his message in interviews and conferences. His charm and enthusiasm, which always impress his audiences, have also helped him persuade many companies to pay for his projects.

But Parker also knows that to deal more effectively with global warming, scientists need to find out more about it. That's why he was happy to provide them with ice samples from his expeditions, and to set up weather station at the South Pole. He is now studying environmental sciences at university, in the hope of becoming a researcher himself. Never afraid of a challenge, he plans to continue doing everything he can to help save the planet.

RAY BRADBURY: SCIENCE FICTION WRITER

The author Ray Bradbury appears on every list of important science fiction writer in the 20th century. In his 71-year career, Bradbury published 27 novels and 600 stories, which have become popular all over the world. This huge number was the result of the routine he followed: Every workday he sat at his desk and wrote at least 1000 words. He continued this habit until a few weeks before his death last year, at the age of 91.

Bradbury grew up in the small American town of Waukegan, enjoying a happy childhood. This period in his life had a strong influence on his future career. He claimed that much of his inspiration came from the fantasy stories his mother read to him when he was a young boy. After he learned to read, his favorite place became the local library, where he spent hours every day. He often said he would never have become a writer if there hadn't been a good library near his home.

Bradbury started writing in high school, and sold his first stories soon after graduating. In 1950, when he was only 30 years old, he published *The Martian Chronicles*, a collection of stories about humans trying to build colonies on the planet Mars. The book quickly became a bestseller, and helped Bradbury gain recognition as a major science fiction writer.

Human beings haven't settled on distant planets yet, but many of the other things that Bradbury imagined have become a reality. For example, long before the invention of wireless communication, they appeared in several of his books. He also described the effects technology would have on society, including the ways in which television would change the world.

Although many of his predictions were correct, Bradbury did not see himself as a prophet. All he really wanted, he said, was to entertain himself and his readers, and there was nothing he liked better than to sit at his desk and write. Indeed, although his mind traveled through space and time, he himself never went very far from home. He refused to get on an airplane, and never even learned to drive.
